

# New district superintendent officially on the job



BEAUFORT – The Beaufort County School District's new superintendent used his first day on the job to visit schools and listen to students and teachers.

Frank Rodriguez, formerly a regional superintendent in the 193,000-student School District of Palm Beach County (Fla)., was selected by the Beaufort County Board of Education on April 16 and officially took over the school district's top leadership position on July 1.

"I'm incredibly humbled and honored by the Board's decision," Rodriguez said. "I look forward to working closely with each Board member and the communities they represent. I'm equally eager to work with our students, teachers and staff to improve outcomes and build trust within Beaufort County."

Rodriguez was selected through a process that began with 110 applications from around the country. Hazard Young Attea and Associates, the Illinois-based educational executive search firm hired by the Board to coordinate the search, selected 48 applicants with professional experiences and personal characteristics that matched a Leadership Profile approved by the Board. That 50-page report was compiled from feedback gathered from more than 1,000 county residents – 366 who attended a series of focus groups and town hall meetings in December and 697 who responded to an online survey.

HYA screened the top 48 applications and presented nine to the Board, which decided to invite seven candidates to Beaufort for personal interviews. The Board selected and interviewed two finalists who then appeared at a public forum to answer questions posed by parents, students, district employees and community members. Forum attendees completed feedback sheets, and those results were reviewed by Board members prior to their final vote. The public forum was also broadcast live by The County Channel.

Both finalists underwent in-depth background reviews by independent third-party investigators. Those reviews included academic credentials, personal credit reports, criminal and civil histories, and a news media and social media review.

Board Chair Cristina Gwozdz said the public's participation in the selection process was invaluable for Board members.

"The Leadership Profile was created entirely from public feedback, and it became the foundation for our nationwide search and for many of our interview questions with candidates," Gwozdz said. "We also got additional feedback at the end of the selection process from community members who participated in Saturday's public forum with our two finalists."

Rodriguez replaces Interim Superintendent Herb Berg, who led the district during the search process.

He began his career in Boca Raton, Fla., as a high school social studies and technology teacher before becoming a program coordinator at Florida Atlantic University, then a district social studies secondary curriculum supervisor for the Palm Beach County School District. He went on to become a high school assistant principal, an elementary school principal and a high school principal before serving in a variety of district-level administrative roles in Palm Beach County.

For the past three years, Rodriguez has been a regional superintendent in Palm Beach County supervising 54 schools and 58,000 students in diverse communities. In his application, he said student achievement had improved, achievement gaps had decreased and high school graduation rates had increased to 91 percent. He led the district's regional efforts to pass two bond referendums in three years.

Rodriguez has a Bachelor's Degree in Social Studies Education from Florida State University, a Master of Education Degree in Curriculum and Instruction from Florida Atlantic University and a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership from Florida Atlantic University. He has continued his studies by completing the National Superintendents Academy as well as completing several K-12 institutes for K-12 education leaders at Harvard University.

He received a 2016 Leadership Award from the Hispanic Education Coalition of Palm Beach County.

Rodriguez has two sons who will attend district schools.

### DAYS ON THE MARKET FOR RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY.

**We** have seen a very steady and strong real estate market in Northern Beaufort County - for a least the last three years or so. It would not be unreasonable to expect this market to eventually slow down...if for no other reason, the reduced availability of affordable single family homes in our area. One reasonable tool to measure real estate strength, is how long a property takes to sell, in other words the "Days On The Market" or as Realtors call it – DOM.

Looking at the stats below, 2018 turned out to be another good year for the county. The "DOM" average was almost identical to 2017. I believe if it was not for the anomaly of a \$700,000 -\$799,999 listing being on the market for 1106 days, the average DOM would be appreciably down.

In the too distant past, the average time to sell a residential property in the Beaufort are was around five months. As can be seen by looking at the 115 average days to sell, we are now closer to 3.8 months.

One can decipher pretty much whatever one wants to when it comes to stats and numbers. But if two or more similar properties are on the market, and one goes under contract in a timely period and the others stays active for some considerable time over the average, it may tell us there is an issue or issues with that particular property. So having the above DOM information may well become useful to both listing agent and property owner alike
